

SUMMER FEEDING

The Wakulla County School Board will be participating in the Summer Food Service Program during the months of June and July.

Nutritionally balanced meals will be provided to all children regardless of race, color, sex, disability, age, or national origin during summer vacation when school breakfast and lunches are not available. All children 18 years old and younger, if open site, are eligible for meals at no charge and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. The programs are only approved for geographical areas of need where 50 percent or more of the children qualify for free and reduced price meals during the school year.

Summer feeding sites that are located at schools provide meals to all children in the immediate vicinity in addition to those enrolled in summer school. The following sites will be participating in the Summer Food Service Program:

Wakulla Education Center, 87 Andrew Hargrett Sr. Road, beginning Thursday, June 5, 2008, and ending July 31, 2008. The site will offer meals Monday through Thursday when it is open and on Friday, June 6 and June 13. The site will be closed Thursday, July 3. Breakfast will be served from 8:45 – 9:15 and lunch will be served from 11:30 – 12:00 noon.

Medart Elementary, 2558 Coastal Highway, beginning June 11, and ending July 17, 2008. The site will offer meals Monday through Thursday when it is open. The site will be closed Monday, June 30, and Thursday, July 3. Breakfast will be served from 8:30 – 9:00 and lunch will be served from 11:30 – 12:00.

Wakulla High School, 3237 Coastal Highway, beginning June 11 and ending July 17, 2008. The site will offer lunch Monday through Thursday when it is open. The site will be closed Monday, June 30 and Thursday, July 3. Lunch will be served from 11:30 – 12:45.
