2012-13 School Year Prescription Medication Letter

Dear Parents:

If your child is required to take prescription medication at school each day, and you would like this to be administered at school ***you must complete*** a Medication Permission Form. This form is available at the school health clinic. Please be sure that the medication is in its original pharmacy container with accurate dosage information on the label. This medication will be kept in the school clinic.

If you have over the counter medication that your child needs access to at school, ***you must complete*** a Medication Permission Form. ***This medication must be sent in the original sealed product container with product directions available.*** The dosage must comply with product labeling or a note will be required from the child's physician.

School Board policy requires that any medication to be administered to a student on school premises must be brought to school by the parent/guardian. No student will be allowed to have medication in his/her possession on school premises or the school bus with the exception of an Epi Pen or an asthma inhaler prescribed by a physician.
